More birds are in danger of extinction in Hawaii than anywhere else in the United States.

Shorebirds are among the North American birds having the highest conservation concern. Red Knots have declined by an alarming 82%.

Cooperative conservation efforts have restored and protected more than 30 million acres of wetlands.

Inhabitants of Pacific forests, Spotted Owls are declining. They require structurally diverse old-growth forests.

Tricolored herons and other wetland birds benefit from wetlands protection and restoration.

Habitat restoration and management have contributed to recoveries of waterfowl. Populations of Wood Ducks have increased by more than 200% in the past 40 years; they have responded well to programs that have provided nest boxes throughout their range.

Many eastern forest birds are suffering consistent and troubling declines, including Wood Thrushes and other Neotropical migrants that require large blocks of intact forests.
